COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

During February, to keep our communities safe, we focused our patrols to reduce vehicle crime and apprehend offenders. Whilst working towards raising awareness with our public, on how we can work together to reduce such crimes, discussing this during all of our community engagement events.

We have been working with our commercial community, engaging with our stores and shoppers, offering advice about steps that can be taken to improve personal safety and staying safe when out and about.

In addition, we have continued to work with our primary schools, speaking with our year 6 students regarding antisocial behaviour and the impacts of it. To date, since Sept 2023, we have attended 35 schools, given 66 (70 minute) presentations, and have spoken with 1,861 children.

DISTRICT STATISTICS



A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers have dealt with during February:

We helped to find 7 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We responded to 11 mental-health related incidents and worked with local partners to help those concerned get the help and support they needed.

We investigated 33 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 20 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 103 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 38 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We have submitted 141 pieces of intelligence which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 28 people within our district to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.
