WORKING TO REDUCE KNIFE CRIME

During May, your Neighbourhood Policing Team have been working to see a reduction in knife crime. As a result of Op. Sceptre we have asked for community support in the safe disposal of unwanted knives or bladed articles, to reduce the risk of them being used as weapons. We have been out in our communities having open conversations to raise awareness and signs to look out for. We deployed our knife arch into Rayleigh town, which allowed for a better understanding of the equipment we use to prevent and detect.



Our Town Centre Team was supported by dedicated Police Cadets, who joined together for a proactive evening of test purchasing across the district, during which our young cadets attempted to purchase knife related products at the till points, both manned and self-service, from a variety of stores and we are pleased to say that on all occasions no sales were authorised and we spent time in our schools, discussing antisocial behaviour, criminality and the risks regarding knifes. DISTRICT STATISTICS













A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers dealt with during April 2025:

We helped to find 13 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We investigated 34 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 23 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 121 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 53 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We submitted 180 pieces of intelligence, which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 30 people within our district, to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.
